


















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Gatekeeping

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Gatekeeping

- 4 key roles of Gatekeeping
 - Prevent children's separation from families,
 - Support the transition of children,
 - Place children in alternative care
 - Monitor children in care

- A dedicated Cadre of professionals-Case management
- Community-driven interventions-Comm. Hub
- Holistic approach for family support-AFS model
- Emergency foster care and other alternative care


